# The Month in Brief

Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Class

The Bombay, Solapur and Nagpur Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Class for the month of February 1979 with the average prices for the year ended December 1960 equal to '100 were 323, 343 and 324 respectively. The Jalgaon, Nanded, Pune and Aurangabad Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Class for the month of February 1979 with the average prices for the year ended December 1961 equal to 100 were 333, 347, 314 and 356 respectively.

#### ALL INDIA AVERAGE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX NUMBER FOR INDUSTRIAL WORKERS

All India Average Consumer Price Index Number for Industrial Workers (General) on Base 1960=100 for February 1979 is 329 as compared to 332 in January 1979. The Index Number for February 1979 on base 1949=100 derived from the 1960 based index works out to 400 as against 404 for January 1979.

#### Industrial Disputes in Maharashtra State

During January 1979, there were 57 strikes involving 19, 788 workmen and a time loss of 1,79,521 working days, as compared to 47 disputes in December 1978, involving 20,973 workmen and a time loss of 2,44,782 man-days. ## Current Notes

Free and Happy Life for the Common Man

The Prime Minister Shri Morarji Desai, said that it has been the endeavour of his Government to see that the administration gives proper protection to all to remove the fears of oppression so that everybody works with confidence not only for the fulfilment of his own purpose but also in consonance with happy human society. Shri Desai was addressing the nation over All India Radio and Doordarshan in Hindi and English. He said that the present Central Government had three tasks before it Restoring democracy, providing full employment in 10 years and bringing about complete integration of the minds of all people. Most of the freedoms had been restored and the aberrations in the Constitution had been largely removed. The development of the villages has been taken in hand much more vigorously than ever before. The situation was easy on the food front.

In international relations, the prestige and reputation of India has gone up as never before because of its policy of non-alignment. Relations with neighbours are much better than at any time before. Thanking people for their co-operation, the Prime Minister reminded them that the strength of the country lies in the strength of every citizen, in his freedom from fear and that has to be done through democracy and democratic way of life which we are trying to constantly strengthen.

The following is the transcript of the Prime Minister's broadcast in English :-

'I am appearing before you when we have entered the third year of the stewardship of the Government in which you put us on 24th March 1977 for a period of five years and on a programme which we have placed before you as Janata party, which you have approved. We have been trying to fulfil the man-date which you have given us during the last two years.

We had three tasks before us. One was putting back democratic values and safeguarding them, which had been eroded and which created danger of dictatorship in this country and took away the freedom of the people, the Press and also the judiciary.

The second task was of seeing that the condition of the people of this country which is very poor for the majority of the people is changed and there is no unemployment at the end of ten years and that there is more satisfaction in one's life for every person through employment, getting proper food, education, housing and a peaceful life with full freedom.

And the third task which is the main task is the task of complete integration of the minds of all our people in the common cause of making this country the happiest in the world.

We had to attend first-restoring the freedom which had been taken away and it is a matter of some satisfaction for you and for your servants whom you have accepted that we have fulfilled that task fairly satisfactorily by now and much of our time and energy had to be spent on that account.

The freedom of the Press has been completely restored and I would challenge any person who can show that there is even the semblance of interference in the freedom of the Press by Government on any occasion during the last two years. We have restored the independence and freedom of the judiciary, to give justice as they think proper in their wisdom and we have also restored the freedom of the individual to think and to speak and to work according to his conscious in furtherance of his welfare, in conformity with the interest of the whole society and the country. We, therefore passed the necessary legislations also but we have failed a little short of undoing all the meddling that was done with the Constitution by the 42nd Constitutional Amendment Act. We have restored most of the freedoms in the democracy that are guaranted by the Constitution which were taken away barring one or two items which we could not do because of a want of majority in the Rajya Sabha, where we had to accept a little set back in order that the main task was done. Whatever has remained will certainly be fulfilled in due course as soon as we get the opportunity.

The next task of giving full employment to the people and giving them satisfaction in the matter of water, food clothing and housing, is also being pursued. There are about hundred and sixteen thousand villages in the country which are without a satisfactory source of drinking water and people are put to great difficulty as estimated so far. We have taken up the task of supplying proper drinking water to all these villages within five years. In the first year 18,000 villages, have already been supplied and we are confident that, during the next five years, we will be able to fulfil this want so that the primary necessity of man is guaranteed to every citizen in this country which was not done during the last thirty years of our freedom.

We have also now a food supply which is quite—not only sufficient for our needs, but we have been some surpluses and this year also the crops will give us more surpluses whereas formerly we were importing foodgrains. We are now not importing foodgrains but we are helping some friends with some foodgrains from our surpluses as it was our duty to do so. And we have no doubt that we will be producing much more than what we are producing today in the course of the next five or six years and I am sure you must be seeing that you have now full and adequate supplies of your daily needs in the market without having to stand in queue and at proper prices which can compare very fabourably with any prices two years ago which are not increasing and of quality which is much better for the average person that it was possible for him to get during the previous years on account of a free exchange of the produce ; agricultural produce, throughout the country.

In the matter of housing, we are also undertaking a programme to see that adequate housing is obtainable to all people in the cities and in the rural areas in the course of next few years for which a proper programme is being, taken up. We are providing house sites to all those who have none, some were provided before but the arrangement was not properly implemented. Sometimes it was done in the name but now, we are trying to see and we are seeing that house sites are properly given and people are put in possession of them and they are then enabled to build houses according to their capacity.

If whatever help can be given by the State. We are also seeking that more and more employment is created for the people, more self-employment avenues are available to all our people and for that we have directed the banks to give loans to people, who can be self employed with advantage and to help them to do so.

It is a matter of some satisfaction that banks, amongst themselves, have adopted by now 55,000 villages for this purpose and even for making development all round development in those areas. There are various programmes taken up for seeing that the rural life which is the major portion of our country, which covers 80 per cent of our people is enriched, is made satisfactory and which enables them to see that the country takes it proper place in the world economy and in the world society. It is, therefore, we are now giving priority to the rural areas and therefore to agriculture, to small scale village and cottage industries particularly to poultry farming, to animal husbandry, which can give employment also to many people and much more milk then is available to the people in future. This is how we are trying to see that the rural life becomes richer and the results now are beginning to come. I hope it is not imagined by anybody that all these tasks can be completed quickly and soon it does take some time and therefore we said that in ten years, now eight years left, we will see that employment is given to every person in the country.

There are certain aberrations in our society which are a blot on our society for which we have suffered also and we have been suffering. They are distinctions of high and low, of higher castes and lower castes, of untouchability, the neglect of the tribal areas, the question of minority and communal troubles, oppression of harijans. These questions are being tackled now with greater vigour. I can't claim that they are solved already completely.

It is a legacy which we have got for many centuries which we are now trying to overcome and I am hopeful that the administration does its duty in giving proper protection to all people and, to removing fear of oppression so that everybody works with confidence, without fear, for not only his fulfilment of life's purpose but also for doing it in consonance with a happy human society in this country with the intention and aim of also sceing that we controbute, to seeing that the whole world community of human society becomes happy and lives in peace.

That does not certainly mean that we have done everything that could have been done, but we can say that we have been doing all that was humanly possible for us to do with the capacities that we have, we are trying to increase those capacities not of ourselves only, but the capacities of every citizen of the country because ultimately the strength of the country lies in the strength of every citizen, in his freedom from fear and that has to be done through democracy and democratic way of life which we are trying to constantly strengthen.

## Promotion of Self-Employment of Women-Task Force submits Report

The task force on special programmes for self-employment of women has recommended to Government to set up an organisation under the Ministry of Industry to formulate programmes and policies for the promotion of selfemployment of women and to monitor the implementation of these programmes.

t of women has ber the Ministry of romotion of selfnese programmes. Although located within the Industry Ministry, the organisation will work in co-ordination and have appropriate liaison with all concerned Central and State Government Departments and agencies like Handicrafts and Handloom Boards, KVIC, Central Social Welfare Board, etc. This organisation, the task force says, should take an overall view of the broad policy formulations in regard to training programmes also and should co-ordinate with the concerned agencies. The task force submitted its report to Industry Minister Shri George Fernandes here today.

The task force was set up in October, 1978, under the chairmanship of the Minister of State for Industry, Smt. Abha Maiti. Its terms of reference required that various schemes of self-employment for women and the training programmes including those of entrepreneurship development for women, should be reviewed and examined with a view to make these more purposeful, and, that new initiatives and more opportunities for self-employment of women be suggested.

In order to focus adequate attention on the problems of women at district level, the task force has recommended that at each District Industries Centre there should be an officer to take care exclusively of the requirements of women entrepreneurs.

It has also recommended that in respect of benefits and allocations under programmes and projects of various sectors, at least 25 per cent of these should be for women. When speaking of assistance and benefits for women, those from rural are as feature predominantly as the target group. The force has suggested that women may be broadly categorised into three groups depending upon their age, education and acquired skills, and, the programmes for selfemployment and training of women should be evolved to suit separate requirements of each group.

As the king-pin of all community development activities in respect of women are the Gram Sevikas and the Mukhya Gram Sevikas, the task force has recommended that the Mahila Mandals should be strengthened and adequate attention given to the training of Gram and Mukhya Sevikas to enable them to play their role fully in promoting self-employment amongst rural women.

The task force has also supported the idea of setting up of women's development corporations and directorates of women's welfare at the State levels.

Members of the task force included representatives of State Governments, Central Government departments dealing with women's welfare, labour, training, etc., private entrepreneurs and representatives of non-Government Welfare Organisations.

State Sick Unit Programme Covers 750 Industries

Seven hundred and fifty sick units out of 1,575 identified units are being nursed by banks and financial institutions under the sick unit programme. Out of the units being nursed, 312 units are from Bombay and Thane region and 215 from Pune District. The Bank of Maharashtra tops the list by taking up 276 sick units for nursing.

This information was given at the 12th meeting of the State Level Co-ordination Committee on Sick Units held under the Chairmanship of

Shri P. D. Kasbekar, Secretary, Industries, Energy and Labour Department at Mantralaya 'today.

The Chairman informed the Committee that the M. S. E. B. had withdrawn its condition of furnishing a bank guarantee in respect of the arrears towards electricity charges to be recovered from the sick units. The M. S. S. I. D. C. was requested to review those cases in which the Corporation had decided to go ahead with the recovery of dues, if such cases were being nursed by the banks.

Shri Kasbekar informed the meeting that the Institute of Cost and Work Accounts of India had agreed to render voluntary services to sick units in respect of accounting and costing.

The Maharashtra State Finance Corporation would also soon evolve its own scheme of equity funds to sick units, he added.

The Government had already taken a decision to convert sales tax arrears of sick units under nursing into loans as from the Government.

Shri V. Chari, Joint Secretary, Industries and Labour Department and Smt. Chitkala Zutsi, Joint Director, Directorate of Industries were also present at the meeting.

#### NLI Plan for Bonded Labour

The National Labour Institute proposes to launch a number of programmes to rehabilitate bonded labour as also to educated trade union leaders and workers involved in organising rural labour during the year 1978-80.

The General Council of the Institute which met here on March 20, also decided to organise full length regular courses for training researches and field workers at State, district and grassroot levels.

At the meeting a new eight member executive council was elected with the Planning Commission Deputy Chairman, Dr. T. D. Lakdawala, as Chairman.

The Union Labour Minister, Shri Ravindra Varma, who is also President of the institute, presided over the meeting of the Council.

### Amendments proposed to E. S. I. Act

The Employees' State Insurance Corporation adopted on February 24, 1979 the report of the High-Power Sub-Committee set up to suggest amendments to the existing Employees' State Insurance Act. The report underscores the urgent need to extend coverage of ESI scheme to weaker sections of workers including those who did not enjoy any social security benefit. It further wanted workers of sugar factories, who constitute a sizeable organised. group of industrial workers, to be covered under the scheme. The report also indicates the possibility of raising the ceiling for coverage to Rs. 1,600 per month from the existing coverage limit of Rs. 1,000. The power to increase this ceiling from time to time might be vested with the Central Government.

ESI Scheme extended to Construction Industry The Union Minister of State for Labour said on March 11, 1979 that the Government of India has decided to extend the Employees' State Insurance Scheme to construction workers in those cities and towns where the scheme is already in force. He added that the scheme would cover all construction establishments employing 20 persons or more, including contract labour.

#### Proposed Amendments to Gratuity Act

The Union Minister of Labour, Mr. Ravindra Varma, told the Lok Sabha on March 15, 1979, that the proposed amendments to the Gratuity Act had been delayed because some Central Trade union organisations, among others, had not replied to the proposals. These include extension of the coverage of the Gratuity Act to ensure that the benefits reached a wider section, to clarify that employees should be entitled to gratuity at the rate of 15 times of daily wages for every completed year of service or more.

#### Workers tell of their discontent

American workers basically like their jobs-but they have plenty of worries.

That's the finding of a third nationwide sample of the U.S. working population, released this past week by the U.S. Labor Department.

Some of the major findings are:

Family income.—About one in five workers judged their family income inadequate to meet their monthly expenses. Among black workers, however, the proportion was substantially higher—three in five.

Fringe benefits.—Almost six out of 10 workers expressed a desire for improvements, in their existing fringe benefits, with medical insurance, retirement programs, dental plans and paid vacations most frequently cited.

Wage tradeoff.—About half of the workers interviewed expressed willingness to trade a hypothetical 10 per cent pay raise for improved retirement benefits, better medical insurance or more paid vacation days. However, less than one in five would forego such a raise for less tiring work, more job autonomy or somewhat safer or more healthful working conditions.

Safety and health.—More than three-fourths of the workers reported exposure in their employment to one or more of 13 listed safety and health hazards. An equal proportion felt that workers should have "complete say" or "a lot of say" in workplace decisions involving safety equipment and practices.

Underutilization.—More than one-third of the respondents said they had skills they would like to use but could not use on their present jobs. Almost as many expressed the belief that they had more education than was required by their jobs.

Labor unions.—If representation elections were to be held, about 30 per cent of the unorganized whitecollar workers and 40 per cent of the unorganized

bluecollar workers would vote in favor of union representation. Although union members in 1977 expressed criticism of some aspects of their unions' performance, more than seven out of 10 reported that, all in all they were either "very" or "somewhat" satisfied with their unions.

The report is based on hour and a half personal interviews conducted by experienced researchers to give a clear picture of what workers in all occupations think of their jobs. It is the third such survey, the first being conducted in 1969 and the second in 1973.

The official name of the study is "The 1977 Quality of Employment Survey" and was prepared by the Survey Research Center of the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The findings on unions are new in this survey and show—as the recent Missouri right-to-work referendun underscored—that organized workers have a strong preference for unions, despite the propaganda against unions which blares at them from all sides.

The strong desire for more and bigger fringe benefits which the study also reveals tells how American workers, both blue and whitecollar, want a national health insurance system, and why the present costly system of private health insurance system is not working.

#### 323—A fall of 1 point

In February 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Bombay Centre with base year January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 323 being 1 point lower than that in the preceeding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at the Bombay Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 3 points to 340 due to a fall in the average prices of rice, bajra, arhardal, gramdal, masurdal, uriddal. coconut oil, groundnut oil, vanaspati, goatmeat, eggs, milk pure, salt, turmeric, chillies dry, onion, garlic, kalimiri, zeera, lavang and sugar.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc., group increased by 2 points to 344 due to a rise in the average prices of panleaf, supari and cigarettes.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 6 points to 404 due to a rise in the average prices of firewood and charcoal.

The index number for housing remained steady at 153 being a six monthly item.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and footwear group increased by 1 point to 351 due to a rise in the average prices of dhoti, shirting (I and II), trouser cloth, full pant, shoes gents and chappals ladies.

The index number for the miscellaneous group remained steady at 273.



## 343-A fall of 4 points

SOLAPUR\*

In February 1979 the Consumer Price Index Number for working class (New series) for the Solapur centre with base year January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 343 being 4 points lower than that in the preceeding month. The index number relates to the standard of Life ascertained during the year 1958-59 Family Living Survey in Solapur City.

The index number for the food group decreased by 9 points to 355, due to a fall in the average prices of rice, jowar, arhardal, gramdal, masurdal, turmeric, chillies, dry, tamarind, garlic, coconut, sugar, gur, jalebi and fall in the subgroup index number of vegetable and fruits.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc. group increased by 13 points to 321 due to a rise in the average prices of pan leaf supari.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and Footwear group increased by 5 points to 390 due to a rise in the average prices of saree, long cloth, shirting (*i*) and Markin.

The index numbers for the Fuel and Light and Miscellaneous groups and Housing remained steady at 402, 275 and 200.

## 324-A fall of 4 points

NAGPUR\*

In February, 1979 the Consumer Price Index Number for working class (New series) for the Nagpur Centre with base year January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 324 being 4 points lower than that in the preceeding month. The index number relates to the Standard of Life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family Living Survey in Nagpur City.

The index number for the food group decreased by 8 points to 347 due to a fall in the average prices of arhardal, groundnut Oil, linseed Oil, eggs, turmeric, chillies dry, onions, garlic, corriander, ginger, zeera, sugar, gur and fall in the sub-group index of vegetable and fruits.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc. group increased by 4 points to 289, due to a rise in the average price of pan leaf only.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and Footwear group decreased by 2 points to 397 due to and fall in the average price of dhoti, long cloth, and martin (i).

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 1 point to 245 due to a rise in the average price of hair oil and cot.

The index number for the Fuel and Light group and Housing reminded steady of 344 and 187.

#### AURANGABAD\*

#### 356-A fall of 1 point

In February 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for Aurangabad Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 356 being 1 point lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Aurangabad Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 8 points to 380 due to a fall in the average prices of wheat, jowar, turdal, gramdal, masurdal, groundnut oil, turmeric, chillies dry, tamarind, zeera, potatoes, onions, tomatoes, sugar and gur.

The index number for the fuel and light group remained steady at 393.

The index number for housing increased by 32 points to 266.

The index number for the clothing and footwear group remained steady at 363.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 9 points to 280 due to a rise in the prices of pan-leaf, sunlight, lifebuoy and hamam.

#### 347—A fall of 1 point

In February 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for working class (New Series) for the Nanded Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 347 being 1 point lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Nanded Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 2 point to 373 due to a fall in the average prices of chillies dry potatoes, onions, brinjals, tomatoes; garlic and other vegetables.

The index number for the fuel and light group remained steady at 453. The index number for housing remained steady at 196 being six monthly item.

The index number for the clothing and foot-wear group increased by 3 points to 329 due to a rise in the average prices of dhoti and coloured poplin.

(Average prices for the calender year 1961=100)

The index number for the miscellaneous group remained steady at 265.

#### 333—A rise of 6 points

In February 1979, the consumer price index number for working class (New Series) for the Jalgaon Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 333 being 6 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family. living survey in Jalgaon Centre.

The index number for the food group increased by 8 points to 359 due to a rise in the average prices of rice, wheat, goat meat, onions, and other vegetables.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 7 points to 417 due to a rise in the average prices of firewood only.

The index number for housing remained steady at 158 (being six monthly item).

The index number for the clothing and footwear group increased by 5 points to 329 due to a rise in the prices of dhoti and cloth for trouser.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 1 point to 266 due to a rise in the price of hair oil only.

#### BENEFITS UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' STATE INSURANCE SCHEME-REVIEW FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 1979

The Employees' State Insurance Scheme applies to 26 centres in the State of Maharashtra and provides protection to 14,83,411 workers in the event of employment injury, sickness and maternity. This protection is made available in two ways, namely by provision of medical care and cash benefits when needed. During the month of February 1979, 14,008 Insured Persons received Rs. 27,99,029 93 cash benefits due to employment injuries. This includes 4,419 persons who were in receipt of pensions for permanent disablement and 17,163 persons who were in receipt of Dependent Benefit as dependent's of deceased Insured Persons. During the month, 10,603 accidents were reported as against 11,531 during the preceding month.

Comparatively fewer persons need the employment injury benefits but a fairly large number need Cash Benefit in the event of sickness. During February 1979, 1,04,574 claims were received and an amount of Rs. 73,31,631.60 was paid out as Sickness Benefit. During the preceding month 1,09,428 claims were received and an amount of Rs. 81,41,569.05 was disbursed as Sickness Benefit.

Some Insured Persons suffering from T. B., Mental, Malignant, other long term diseases etc., require more attention and they are being paid additional benefit called Extended Sickness Benefit. During the month an amount of Rs. 7,49,059 28 paid towards this benefit.

During the month 373 Insured Women Workers claimed Rs. 4,60,770.80 by way of Maternity Benefit. The attendance at the dispensaries as per certifi-cates received was 3,00,487 during the month.

During the month Funeral Benefit in 178 cases amounting to Rs. 17,794.55 was paid.

During the month confinement charges in respect of wives of Insured Persons amounting to Rs. 78,990.00 were paid.

During the month an amount of Rs. 8,011.00 was paid as Enhanced Sickness Benefit to 66 Insured Persons who had gone under sterilisations operation for Family Planning.

For recovery of arrears of contribution under the scheme, legal proceeding had to be initiated in 11 cases against defaulting employers.
