Dear Shri P.B. Gajendragadkar,

We wish to thank you for the invitation to appear before the Commission and give oral evidence on the various issues before it.

We must, however, point out that the way in which the Commission allowed itself to be used by the Government of India on the eve of the recent one day token strike by the Central Government employees is not one that inspires confidence in the Commission.

On the other hand, the Government of India is pushing forward its Bill to ban strikes by Government employees and certain other categories of workers. The fact that the National Commission on Labour has wide terms of reference and all these issues will be covered in its report has not deterred the Government.

And the strangest part is that the Commission has not even uttered a word of protest so far.

Under the circumstances, we feel that no useful purpose will be served by our appearing before you.

We, therefore, regret that we are unable to accept your invitation and appear before you.

Dear Shri Datar,

I was thinking of meeting the Commission with a view to give oral evidence as per your letter in this regard, but our old Comrade Dange resigned from the Membership of the Commission in connection with the strike of the Central Government Employees on the 19th September, 1968. We condemn the way in which the resignation of Comrade Dange was considered by the Commission and the hasty manner in which the Government accepted the resignation. I discussed this with Shri Dange and had a first-hand knowledge on the subject. I do not appreciate the way the Government and the Commission have treated this matter. In the circumstances I do not feel it would serve any useful purpose to meet the Commission. I, therefore, regret my inability to attend the meeting of the Commission.
